

NOTICE OF RACE

CORINTHIAN CUP REGATTA

OCTOBER 19-20, 2019

Organizing Authority: Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 USCG approved PFDs shall be worn at all times by competitors while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing. The ‘Y’ flag will not be flown. This modifies RRS 40 and the preamble to Part 4.
- 1.3 Sabot A, Sabot B, and Sabot C1 fleet boats are required to carry weights if under the minimum weight requirement and may be subject to on-water equipment inspection upon the finish of each race. Refer to INSA class rules for a list of required equipment.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all junior age CFJ, Naples Sabot, and RS Tera sailors.
- 2.2 Skipper must be a member in good standing of INSA, RS Tera, CFJ Class Association.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter by submitting the entry form and paying the entry fee online at <https://www.regattatoolbox.com/eventDetails?eventID=KN8yVQTBEO> on or before Friday 10/19/19 at 17:00 PST. Walk-up registration will be accepted at Check-In beginning at 0930 on Saturday 10/20/19. **Advance registration is greatly appreciated.**

3. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- 3.1 Mandatory check-in for all competitors will be open Saturday 10/20/19 from 0930 until 1030 on the lower patio at BCYC.

4. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available online on or before Saturday 10/20/19 and upon Check-In at BCYC.

5. RACING VENUE AND COURSES

- 5.1 All classes will sail in the vicinity of “Five Points” (Turning Basin) and/or the south Lido Channel.

- 5.2 Depending on entries, the racing area for Sabot C2, Sabot C3 and RS Tera classes will be located in the South Lido Channel.
- 5.3 Courses may be a windward/leeward or any variation of a triangle course. Course diagrams will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
- 6. SCORING**
 - 6.1 Three (3) races must be completed to constitute a series.
 - 6.2 When five (5) or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of his/her race scores. This changes RRS A2.
 - 6.3 The Corinthian Cup perpetual trophy will be awarded to the yacht club with the best combined participation and overall high point score. High point performance calculation will include only the top five finishers per fleet in all classes and races.

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors in this race participate entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (OA, Race Committee, Protest Committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this race.
